HOSPITABLE HABITATS

Students will observe their favorite Zoo habitat to recreate and emphasize the features all animals need in their homes.

Locate one of your favorite exhibits at the Zoo and carefully observe all the features of the exhibit. If possible, identify each of the elements below before moving on to the next part of this activity (every exhibit may not include all of these features).

- Area for water/food
- Place to hide (quiet or shaded area)
- Shaded area for cooling during warmer weather
- Barrier around the habitat (preventing animals from getting out or people getting in)
- Items for animal enrichment (climbing structures, food treats, etc.)
- Areas where people can view animals
- Protection during storms or cold weather
