

Sea Lion vs Seal

You will need:

- Corrugated cardboard
- Paint or markers
- Scissors
- Glue

Optional:

Hobby knife

Sea Lion Directions:

- 1. Cut out the Sea Lion template pieces and trace them onto a piece of cardboard. Using scissors or a hobby knife cut out the pieces.
- 2. Paint both sides of the cardboard pieces.

- 3. Paint on the nose, eyes and whiskers. Cut out 2 small triangles of cardboard, paint them, and then glue them on each side of the head as sea lions have external ears!
- 4. Fit the notch of the front flipper into the notch on the front of the sea lion's body and glue together. Bend the flippers downward to support the upper body just like a real sea lion does! Repeat with the back flippers. A sea lion can rotate their rear flipper under their body to help them "walk" around on land!













Sea Lion vs Seal


Seal Directions:

- 1. Cut out the seal template pieces and trace them onto a piece of cardboard. Cut out using scissors or a hobby knife.
- 2. Paint both sides of the pieces of cardboard.

3. Paint on the nose, eyes and whiskers. No need for external ears like the sea lion!

4. Fit the notch on the front flippers into the notch on the front of the seal body and glue together. Repeat for the back flippers. Neither the front or back flippers of a seal can hold up their body. They have to scoot around on their belly when on land!
