

You will need:

- Cardboard, pasteboard or cardstock
- Scissors
- Paint or markers

Optional:

- Glue
- Wiggly eyes
- Magnets



North Carolina’s variety of habitats (mountains to coast) provide homes for over 60 different species of salamanders!!!

Directions:

1. Either cut out the provided salamander shape or draw your own. Trace or draw onto cardboard, pasteboard or cardstock.
2. Find a picture of your favorite salamander and paint or use markers to decorate your cutout. I made mine to look like North Carolina’s State Salamander the Marbled Salamander!
3. You can modify the cutout to look like the different varieties of salamanders. Here I cut off the back legs and added external gills to make a Siren salamander!
4. To make a my favorite, the “Snot Otter” (Hellbender) salamander, I cut off the legs and traced the body onto the same material I made the original cutout. I then drew a wavy outside layer to my tracing and cut that out and glued to the bottom of the original cutout. Then I glued the legs back onto the bottom of both layers and painted it to look like a hellbender!



5. You can leave your sallies as is or glue a magnet onto the back and enjoy your sallies the next time you get a snack! :)
